

REGIONAL IDENTIFIER: Philadelphia Region III

ABSTRACT

- Purpose:** This notice establishes and implements a Regional Emphasis Program (REP) for the purpose of conducting inspections within the Oil and Gas Industry. The employers to be targeted are in the Oil and Gas industry and are classified within SIC code 1381 (NAICS code 213111), Drilling Oil and Gas Wells; SIC code 1382 (NAICS codes 213112 and 541360), Oil and Gas Exploration Services; and SIC code 1389 (NAICS codes 213112, 237120 and 238910), Oil and Gas Services Not Elsewhere Classified. The goal of this REP is to reduce the days away case rate and fatality rate in this industry in line with OSHA's Strategic Management Plan.
- Scope:** This Notice applies to Oil and Gas Industry operations located within the jurisdiction of the Region III Area Offices specifically listed in this Notice. Activities that are subject to the Process Safety Management (PSM) standard, 29 CFR 1910.119, are excluded from this emphasis program.


OSHA Product Lines and Services


